Piloting Survey Results

Earlier this spring, the USA Super Region launched a survey to solicit feedback on the 12-month piloting process and materials that have been used the last few years. The intent was to gather feedback to determine what has worked, and to evaluate what may need to be changed/revised.

We are excited to report that we received survey results from 118 couples! We were overjoyed and extremely appreciative of each and every response that was received. We have taken the last few months to thoroughly read and understand each couples' responses. We are taking these to prayer to best discern how the Holy Spirit would like to guide the piloting process in the USA Super Region. These results will be further discussed with the USA Super Region Team throughout this next year.

We believe that everyone can agree that a strong piloting process is necessary to start a new team. As Fr. Caffarel states in

"I really enjoyed our piloting year, and we miss our pilot couple! They were great role models, and helped us to set realistic expectations. At first I felt overwhelmed by all the endeavors, but they reminded us that the goal is progress, not perfection!" the Charter, "A new Team must be started with care. If the beginning is made too hastily without a thorough explanation of the purpose and the methods of the Movement, almost certain failure can be expected." Every new team must start with the same foundation to understand the pedagogy, mystique, and charism of Teams of Our

Lady. A beautiful history of the Piloting process in the USA is documented in this issue of *Magnificat* for your education and

enjoyment. Successful piloting is how the Movement began in the USA and is paramount to the success and growth in the coming years.


From Chart 1, 85% of the respondents felt that the piloting materials helped them develop a closer relationship with their spouse and 84% with their fellow team members. This is encouraging and desired.

Of the twelve topics currently presented in the current Pilot Book "Beginning a New Team", Chart 2 indicates that "communication and sit down" and "conjugal and family prayer" were considered the most helpful. The "Teams Charter"



was ranked as one of the lowest in terms of most helpful.

During the piloting process, the pilot couples and the leadership in USA Super Region often field questions about the Charter, it's history and it's relevance to present day teams. The Charter is critical to understanding the foundation and purpose of Teams established by Fr. Caffarel. The Charter can be likened to the Constitution of the United States followed by a Bill of Rights and Amendments that have made the United States what it is today. Fr. Caffarel submitted the original Charter to Rome in 1947. It has been slightly revised and updated over the years but is still true to Fr. Caffarel's original. Terminology is different from country to country depending on language, translation, and customs. Per the


vision of Fr. Caffarel, our Movement has a unique mystique and pedagogy that both support and drive each other. It is paramount that each couple understand the premise and backbone of the Movement that is the Charter.

This above thought goes hand in hand with the desire to shorten the piloting process from 12 months. In keeping with the current schedule of many teams within the USA as well as the yearly format of many teams throughout the world, we are studying ways to revise the piloting process to 10 months. There are many teams throughout the world that meet 10 times a year and take two months off in the summer for vacations and family activities.

Overall, there was excellent feedback gathered from this survey. Please note that every comment is being taken seriously. There will be much time, thought, and prayer put into evaluating how the current piloting materials were developed to date and how they can be further updated to sustain growth in the Movement for years to come while respecting the vision of our founder, Fr. Henri Caffarel. We look forward to sharing updates with you in the months ahead. Ψ

"I think the piloting process was a great way for our Team to get started. Monthly Sit Down with Your Spouse and Christ

As couples committed to Teams of Our Lady, we mustn't forget about our need to focus on the six endeavors of the movement. As Teams of Our Lady tells us, "The endeavors are attitudes to awaken within us and not merely tasks to be accomplished." Let's have an attitude of awakening and focus on the Monthly Sit Down for this issue.

The Monthly Sit Down is our opportunity to come together with our spouse and discuss where we are going on our path to holiness together.

"And indeed, which of you here, intending to build a tower, would not first sit down and work out the cost to see if he had enough to complete it?" Luke 14:28

It is vital that we sit down regularly and look closely at ourselves and our marriage. We need to recall the ideals that brought us together and pray to God for guidance going forward. The sit down necessitates not only talking but active listening marked by sincerity and love. We are asked to approach each sit down with loving acceptance and an attitude of openness to listen to the heart of our spouse.

To begin a sit down, come together, face each other, and start with prayer. You may want to

hold hands while opening in prayer. Ask the Holy Spirit to guide your hearts and words. If you enjoy reflecting on Scripture together, begin each sit down with Scripture. Once you have opened in prayer, then you can each begin to share on any pressing topic in your life while your spouse actively listens. You each may choose to reflect on your current family life and discuss and pray for each child individually. You may also need to discuss any issues you have with aging parents and how to address them. Finally, don't forget to pray for each other and close in prayer.

Intimacy in a sit down allows the opportunity for healing through the building of mutual trust. A sit down allows us to

deepen our understanding of ourselves and our spouse. A sit down helps us remember that none of us are perfect and that we are navigating this life together on our path to holiness.

As author and poet E.E. Cummins said "Every human person is a mystery that must be learned slowly, reverently, with care, tenderness, and pain...and is never learned completely." The monthly sit down gives us the opportunity to learn even more about our spouse through intimate sharing and active listening. Endeavor to sit down with your spouse each month! \psi



From the Archives: 60 years of Piloting in the USA







Did you ever wonder how Teams came to the United States? It is important to look back and reflect on the commitment and dedication of these early teams and understand how they were formed and piloted.

Although the Teams Movement originated in France in 1938, it wasn't until December 1963 that an English version of the Charter was published. Formal piloting for Teams of Our Lady in the USA

followed shortly. However, seeds had already been planted prior by faithful, energetic European Teams couples who worked and lived in the United States for several years.

In his 1976 article for the Magnificat, titled The Teams of Our Lady Come to the U.S., Andy Favret wrote, "It's not possible to pick a place and a date and say, 'That's where it all began.' Nevertheless, during 1958 three separate seeds began to germinate at widely different locations in the United States. Each of these initiatives would lead to the establishment of a new team — and additional teams would eventually form in each area: Los Angeles, California; Washington, DC; and Boston, Massachusetts." This piloting was done with the encouragement of France, but without the supportive English-translated piloting documents.

Many items have been generously donated to the USA Teams Archives; among them are "The Charter of the Teams of Our Lady" and other piloting-related materials covering four time periods:

Booklets titled "Monthly Letter to New Teams" (translated 1966-1969) and "Study of the Charter" – The Study booklet is undated but is assumed to be from the same time period as it was published jointly by the International Teams Movement in Paris, France and the first U.S. Secretariat in Alexandria, Virginia. A Pilot Couple, termed "the temporary Responsible Couple" led the initial meetings (usually four or five) until the new team elected a

Responsible Couple. Letters had been published to allow a new team up to two years before their formal Commitment Ceremony. The Pilot Couple transitioned the newly formed team to the support of a Liaison Couple (Father Caffarel's idea) to answer any questions and to maintain connection to the Movement.

 Booklets titled "Letter to New Teams" – These booklets, published by the International Teams Movement in Paris, France, are also undated, but assumed to be from the early 1970s since the "Letter to New Teams No. 5" gives Teams statistics as of January 1972. Again, a Pilot Couple attended the first meetings until the new team elected a Responsible Couple. Letters had been published to support a new team one year before their formal Commitment Ceremony. A Pilot Couple transitioned the newly formed Team to the support of a Liaison Couple.

• "Meeting Together in Christ's Name" (often called "the Blue Books") from the mid 1970s – Each numbered booklet packet holds five documents: Study Theme (on white paper), Getting to know the Teams of Our Lady (on green paper), Believing and Living (on yellow paper), Prayers for the Meeting, and Some Suggestions for the Coming Month (both on blue paper). These booklets were designed for a two-year study.

 The current Piloting material, "Meeting Together in Christ's Name, Beginning a New Team" (first published in June 1993) and "Meeting Together in Christ's Name, A Guide for the Piloting Couple" (first published in

April 1995) – This material is designed for a one-year study with a Pilot Couple at each meeting. Because it is important to know about the founder of the Movement, "Father Caffarel Prophet of Marriage" is encouraged for the second year of study.



The early Piloting meetings with new teams in the United States were devoted to studying the "Charter of the Teams of Our Lady". In the Appendix to Pilot Couples and the Chaplains, in the "Monthly Letter to New Teams No. 1" (1967), the Leading Team wrote "...take great care during the first meetings to insist on the introduction to the

Charter...It is very important from the very start to be absolutely agreed on fundamentals."

Piloting has always had at its foundation "The Charter of the Teams of Our Lady". As stated on page 12 of "Guide to the Teams of Our Lady" (2018 Edition), "The founding principles of the Charter were drawn up to preserve faithfulness to the original inspiration of the Movement and to offer teams some firm proposals. Today we are able to see the effects of creating the charter and to appreciate how essential it was for the Movement's growth and development".

The Charter has become our common heritage. Today, inspired by the same ideals for Christian marriage, and using the same methods to accomplish it, thousands of couples throughout the world, speaking different languages and coming from different cultures, discover through their marriage the richness of a deeper love of God."
